Revco Opens Here

Revco D.S., Inc., opened its newest Revco store in Raeford this weekend.

The store is located at 230 Cole Avenue in Raeford-Hoke Village Shopping Center.

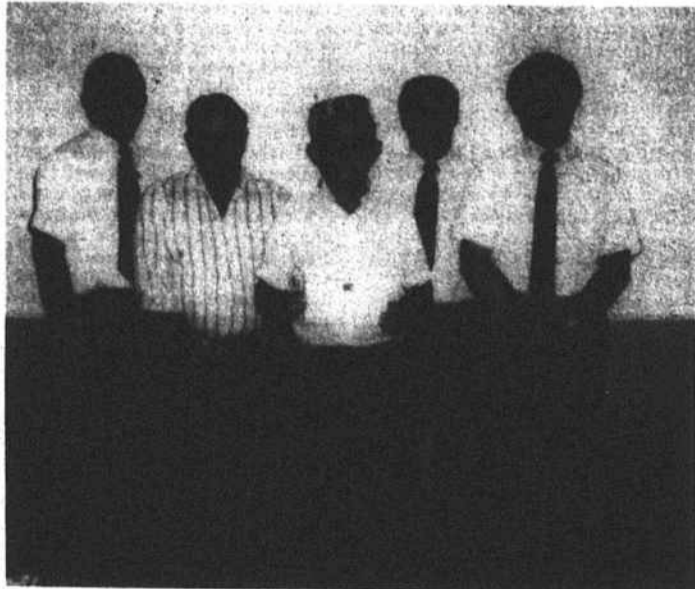

St. Joseph-of-the-Pines Gets Duke Endowment

An award of \$36,000 has been given to St. Joseph-of-the-Pines Hospital for its Home Health Care Program, according to A.H. Gale, Jr., Director of the Hospital and Child Care Divisions of The Duke Endowment.

A total of \$12,000 has now been given by The Duke Endowment to St. Joseph-of-the-Pines Hospital over a two year period for the Home Health Care Program.

St. Joseph Hospital Home Health Agency provides a comprehensive health care service which includes skilled nursing care and other health services to patients essentially confined to their homes in Moore, Lee, Hoke and Anson Counties.

The grant monies are to be used in the implementation of a program to broaden home health care for the elderly by adding new services and consolidating and coordinating existing services.

George Kecatos, Administrator of the Hospital, expressed appreciation to Trustees of The Duke Endowment for their support of this much-needed program.

Since 1951, over \$83,000 has been received by St. Joseph-of-the-

Pines Hospital for operating and miscellaneous purposes from The Duke Endowment.

Carolina hospitals may receive assistance from the Duke Endowment for construction and equipment, charity care, and expanding patient services.

The Duke Endowment also assists children's homes in North Carolina and South Carolina; four educational institutions, Duke, Johnson C. Smith, and Furman Universities and Davidson College; and rural United Methodist churches, retired United Methodist ministers and widows and dependent orphaned children of United Methodist ministers in North Carolina.

The Duke Endowment was established by James B. Duke in 1924, and is today among the largest private foundations in the United States. The market value of Assets amounted to \$406,513,218 on December 31, 1981. Grants made during 1981 totaled 35.6 million -- an increase of \$2.1 million over 1980.

Since 1924, trustees of the Duke Endowment have appropriated more than a half billion dollars -- \$574,019,330 -- to the beneficiaries selected by Mr. Duke.
