On Saturday the Beach family left here for Fort Sill, Oklahoma, where he has been transferred after being stationed at Fort Bragg for the past two years.

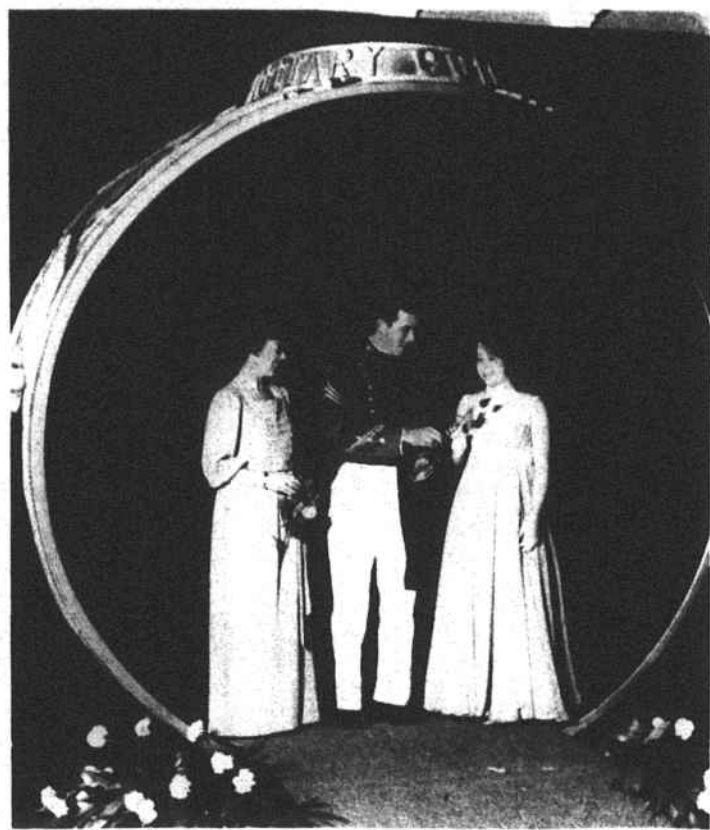
