

Carolina Telephone Changes Regulations

On 3-Party Calls

T.K. McLaughlin, general operator services manager with Carolina Telephone, said, "This new policy will protect customers from being billed for calls they do not authorize. It also will save the company, and ultimately all customers, costs resulting from erroneously or fraudulently billed

"If customers have a toll Calling Card, they can charge their calls back to their home or business phone. Also, some Calling Card calls are cheaper than operatorhandled bill-to-third number

McLaughlin said customers who do not presently have a Calling Card can obtain a free Calling Card by contacting their local business office.
