

Local Reps: Tapped For Committees In NC Legislature

The three representatives of the State House District 16 were among the legislators who have been assigned to House committees for the 1983 session of the General Assembly.

The district is composed of Hoke, Scotland and Robeson counties.

The appointments for State Rep. Danny DeVane of Raeford are on Appropriations, Justice and Public Safety, Expansion Budget, Cultural Resources, Health, and Judiciary II.

John Calvin (Pete) Hasty of Robeson County has been named to Finance, Judiciary III, and Insurance.

Sidney Locks, also of Robeson, has been appointed to Agriculture, Appropriations: Base Budget - Human Resources, Expansion Budget on Human Resources, Commercial Fishing, Government Ethics, Health, and Human Resources.

All are Democrats. State Sen. David Parnell of Robeson, who represents the State Senate District of Hoke and Robeson, has been named chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee on General Government.

In the House, he was chairman of the committee corresponding to the Senate committee he was picked to head for the 1983 session.

Parnell also was named to these Senate committees: vice chairman, Election Laws; and member, Appropriations, Human Resources, Finance, Insurance, Public Utilities and Energy, State Government, and Ways and Means.

Barbara Edwards Completes Basic

The judge said, "This court has nothing but active time for defendant if convicted any time in the future" of writing worthless check.

Larry Chavis, Rt. 1, Red Springs, breaking, entering, and larceny (two counts), larceny, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor (encouraging an 8-year-old boy to assist in the violations), 12 months to two years to be served consecutively, on the charges of breaking, entering, and larceny, with two other charges consolidated with one of the breaking, entering, and larceny charges for judgment; the court recommends that the defendant be given the option of serving the sentence under the work-release program provided he pay Victor Locklear of Rt. 1,

Red Springs, a prosecuting witness, \$50.

Robert Mitchell McLaughlin, Rt. 14, Fayetteville, driving while license revoked, and second offense of driving under the influence, 12 to 18 months suspended for two years, \$400 and costs, not drive for two years, and complete successfully within 90 days the Drug and Alcohol Abuse School.

Jeffrey Purcell, Rt. 1, Box 126, Raeford, trespass, found not guilty, prosecuting witness to pay costs for frivolous and malicious prosecution.

Janie Lee Blue, Vass Road, Box 225, Raeford, larceny, 90 days suspended for three years, \$100 and costs, and not go upon the premises of the prosecuting witness (B.C. Moore's) for three years.

Larry Chavis, Rt. 1, Box 616-B, Red Springs, assault, voluntary dismissal by the prosecutor, at the request of the prosecuting witness.

Bragg, no operator's license, and second offense of driving under the influence, pleaded not guilty, found guilty of no operator's license and found not guilty of DUI, found guilty of careless and reckless driving after drinking, five months suspended for three years, probation for three years, probation not to be terminated during the three years nor will the defendant request a modification of this judgment within a period of three years, pay a fine of \$650 and court costs, surrender license and not drive for three years, complete within 90 days the Drug and Alcohol Abuse School, and follow the guidance and direction of the probation officer in regard to alcoholic rehabilitation.

Elisa Michelle Blackshear, Rt. 2, Raeford, uttering a forged paper, two counts, pleaded guilty to larceny, sentenced to two years suspended for five years, probation for five years, \$100 restitution to Edenborough Pharmacy, and costs.

William Joseph Charles, Jr., Raeford, larceny, 18 months suspended for two years, \$100 and costs, and \$62.75 restitution to Selena Livingston, and not go on the property of the prosecuting witness without written permission.

Roosevelt Johnson, 533 E. Sixth Ave., Raeford, nonsupport, found not guilty.

James Alton Watkins, Rt. 4, Raeford, trespass, prayer for judgment continued, on condition the defendant not go on the premises of the prosecuting witness (Thelma Day) wherever situated, and pay

costs.

Sam Porter, Rt. 3, Fayetteville, assault on a female, found not guilty, prosecuting witness to pay costs for frivolous and malicious prosecution.

Peter Oxendine, Jr., Rt. 2, Box 81A, Raeford, assault on a female, 90 days suspended for two years, probation for two years, costs.

Johnny Davis, Rt. 8, Lumberton, assault by pointing a gun, prayer for judgment continued, costs.

John Venton Powell, Rt. 8, Lumberton, simple assault, prayer for judgment continued, costs.
