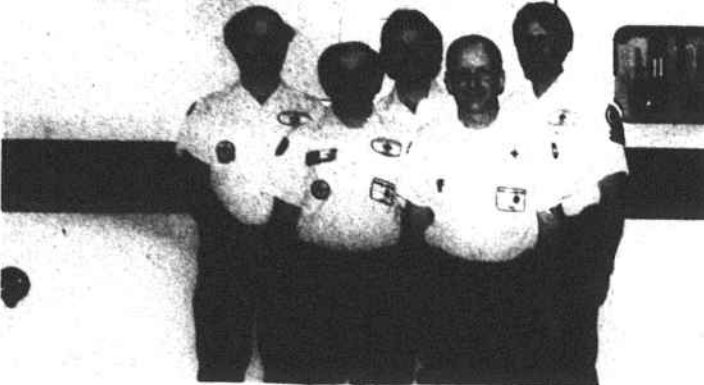

The work of artists native to or residents of Cumberland County is the subject of the second "Close To Home" exhibit at the Fayetteville Museum of Art January 30 - February 13.

"Close to Home" is an invitational biennial exhibition intended to recognize artists in the area for consistent and sustained achievement in the visual arts.

"Close to Home" will feature several artists that participated in the 1981 show, among them painters Fred Dorr, Sandra Smith Rubiera and Barbara Sutherland, potter Bill Dudley, photographer Raul Rubiera, printmaker Silvana

Foti and Margo Dodge.

New artists like weaver Karen Wilson, portrait artist Thomas Moore, Jr., painters Lloyd Nick, Marge Wade and Mike Brady will also be featured.

The "Close to Home" biennial was started to give Cumberland County some idea of the variety and excellence of artists working in the area, or coming from it, in comparison with the museum's varied exhibition program.

The museum is open Tuesday - Friday 10-5, and Saturday and Sunday 1-5. The Fayetteville Museum of Art is located behind Eutaw Shopping Center, off Stamper Road.

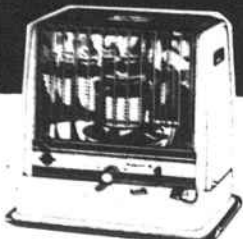
