Raeford Mayor Proclaims February Heart Month

Mayor John K. McNeill Jr. issued a proclamation today designating February as Heart Month and urged Raeford area residents to support the 1983 campaign of the Hoke County Heart Association.

In the proclamation, McNeill asked for support from the residents of Raeford in the campaign against the nation's Number One Killes, heart disease and stroke.

"These diseases accounted for more than 24,000 of deaths in North Carolina last year," McNeill said, "or 49% of deaths from all other causes."

"The American Heart Association urgently needs money to support research so that medicine can

have a better understanding of the basic causes of heart attack, stroke and hypertension," he added. The contributions also support




