## Hoke Cagers Win 3

Hoke High's three basketball teams won their contests Friday over the E.E. Smith squads at the Hoke gym. Hoke played Lumberton at Lumberton Tuesday and will play Terry Sanford at Terry Sanford Friday.

The Hoke girls' 45-37 victory ended a three-game losing streak and put the season's mark at 8-4.

The varsity boys won 56-48, behind Greg Hollingsworth's 20 point scoring performance, bringing their season's mark to 10-4.

The Junior Varsity won 49-41 with Southerland and McRae high for the winners with 12 points each and Council for the losers with 29.

In the girls' game, Sabrina Barnes led Hoke with 22 points. Della Pridden scored 10, Sharon McNeill 4, G. McCormick, Johnson Rheames and Morrison 2 each, and Southerland 1.

For E.E. Smith, Williams scored 14, Bridges 8, Hinton 7, Maynor 4, and Willis 2.

In the boys' varsity game, Kenneth Fleming was Smith's leading scorer with 26 points, Brian Bullock had 10, Flood and Johnson 1 each, Jenkins and Murphy 4 each, and Brickley 2.

For Hoke, besides Hollingsworth, the scorers were McRae 16, Easterling 12, and McLaurin and McLean 4 each.

The races consisted of a two mile and a five mile race. The races were sponsored by Caughman Road Park and the South Carolina Governor's Council on Physical Fitness.

In the five mile race the Road Runners had four runners entered. All four were running in the 14 and under age division. Don Woods won second place in this division and placed 39th overall.

Allen R. Jacobs won third in his age division and placed 51st overall. Also competing in the five mile race for the Road Runners was Robert Lambert, who finished 52nd overall, and Robert Jacobs who finished 74th overall.

There were 172 registered runners in the 5 mile race.

In the two mile race, the Road runners had 9 runners entered to compete with the 92 other runners registered for the race.

## Horsley, McKinnon Named Week's Top Athletes

Orlando McKinnon and Icesonnia Horsley have been named as Male and Female Athletes of the Week for the week of January 24-28 by the Hoke High coaching staff. The honor is a repeat for both athletes this year.

McKinnon, a 165 pound junior member of the Buck Wrestling team was named Male Athlete of the Week for his performances in last week's victories over Pinecrest and E.E. Smith.

In the Pinecrest match, which Hoke won 35-22, Orlando scored a superior decision over his opponent.

In the 47-27 victory over E.E. Smith, Orlando pinned his opponent in 5 minutes and 35 seconds of the match. Orlando is now 11-6 for the season and 3-2 in conference matches.

Icesonnia Horsley, a 14 year old, 5'9" forward on the Freshmen Girls' Basketball Team, received the nod as Female Athlete of the

Week for her performances in the Hoke victories over East Lee and Reid Ross.

In the East Lee game, which Hoke won by a score of 48-44, Icesonnia scored 14 points and had 15 rebounds.

In the 39-29 victory over Reid Ross, she scored 10 points and had 16 rebounds.

In the combined two games, Icesonnia was 11 for 17 from the floor for a 65% accuracy rate.

## Hoke Wrestlers Take Two

The Hoke High wrestling team ran its conference record to four wins and one loss with two victories last week against conference opponents Pinecrest and E.E. Smith.

On Thursday night, Hoke defeated Pinecrest by a score of 35-22. The match was a very tough one for the Bucks, and the outcome was not decided until the second to last match.

True to form, Hoke's lightweights built up a lead for the Bucks, the middleweights produced no points, and the match was decided by the victories in the heavyweight divisions.

In the 100 pound division, Billy Locklear ran his season record to 11-3 by pinning his opponent. Kevin Locklear then wrestled to a draw in the 107 pound division.

After a Hoke loss in the 114 pound weight class, Don Woods, at 121 pounds, and Marvin Peques, at 128 pounds, scored decisions over their opponents to make the score 14-8 in Hoke's favor.

Hoke's score would remain at 14 as Pinecrest amassed 14 straight points in the middleweight divisions to carry the score to 22-14.

The match would be closed out with the Bucks winning the last four matches in the heavyweight divisions.

Orlando McKinnon, at 169 pounds, recorded a superior decision; Darrell Kelly, at 187 pounds, recorded a pin; Robert Moody, at 197 pounds, recorded a major decision; and Charles Matthews, in the unlimited division, received a forfeit to make the final score 35-22.

In the match against E.E. Smith on Friday night, the Bucks' had a much easier time as they captured a 47-27 victory.

The match began as most others have, with Hoke building an early lead in the lightweight divisions.

Billy Locklear, at 100 pounds, won by forfeit.

John Davis, at 107 pounds, pinned his opponent.

After a Buck loss in the 114 pound division, Hoke recorded three pins by Marvin Peques, Richard McLaughlin, and Ricky Allen and a superior decision by Tyrone Jackson to build an unsurmountable 35-6 lead.

With two more victories in the heavyweight divisions, pins by Orlando McKinnon and Robert Moody, the Bucks closed out the match with a 47-27 final score.
