## City Tag Deadline Set For Feb. 15

A deadline for registering vehicles for all Raeford residents has been set at February 14. Police Chief Leonard Wiggins said.

Registration fees are \$3, and if residents are caught without the proper vehicle stickers, fines could run as high as \$31, Wiggins said.
