given a technical foul after each minute had expired and after three technicals the officials declared a Reid Ross forfeit.

Despite the forfeit, Parsons said that Friday nights game was a good defensive showing for his team and especially for two of his players, George McLaurin and Barry Easterling.

Parsons also said that this year's team, which is tied with Pinecrest for first place in the conference and ranked sixth in Eastern North Carolina, is overall a better balanc-ed team than last years. "We have better inside players, a little more depth and a lot bigger boys than last year," said Parsons.

The Bucks have three more ames to play, one of which is with Pinecrest.


