DeVane, House Team Take On PSU Faculty

On Wednesday, March 23, a benefit basketball game between members of the North Carolina House of Representatives and the Pembroke State University faculty will be played at 8 p.m. in PSU's English E. Jones Health and Physical Education Center.

Proceeds from the game will go into PSU's TV Project.

Rep. Daniel DeVane of Raeford was instrumental in having such a game. He is a member of a legislators' team which each year plays the faculty of N.C. State University.

Writing to Dr. Matt Morrison, director of PSU's radio and TV communications, DeVane said: "As a member of the N.C. House of Representatives basketball team, I think a game with your faculty would create a lot of interest.'

Tickets to the benefit game are \$3 for adults and \$1 for students.

McMillan Hits 1,000 Points In UNC-W Play

Former Hoke County standout Sharon McMillan became only the second 1,000-point scorer in UNC-Wilmington women's basketball history during the recently con-cluded 1982-83 season.

McMillan, a swing player who plays both guard and forward for the Lady Seahawks, scored her 1,000th point on February 23rd in 74-67 loss to East Carolina here.

After missing the first seven games of the 82-83 season for

academic reasons, the 5'8 junior started slowly in early January but came on to hit double figures in nine of UNCW's last 11 games. She netted a season-high of 29 points in a 101-79 win over St. Augustine's in Mid-February.

The quick-handed McMillan was particularly effective in the year's final four outings, averaging 20 points, five assists and five steals per game during that stretch.


