Saturday May 14th there will be a G.A. Day Camp at Camp Rockfish.

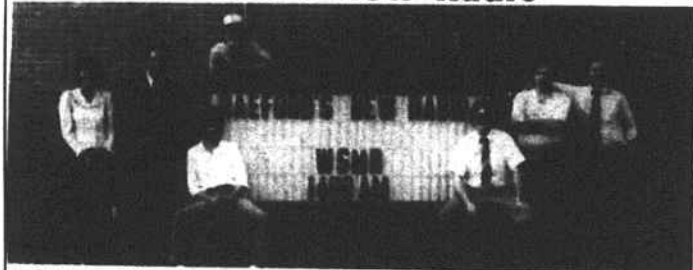
