Zoo Poster Contest Open To Hoke Pupils

Students in kindergarten through eighth grade will be invited to compete for scholarship awards in the second poster animal contest sponsored by the North Carolina Zoological Park and Pizza Hut restaurants statewide.

The zoo is inviting schools in Hoke County and throughout North Carolina to participate in

the contest during May. The contest is designed to encourage the study of wildlife and promote the state zoo near Asheboro.

Pizza Hut is contributing a \$2,000 scholarship award to the state winner in each of two age groups, and a \$2,000 education grant to each state winner's school.

Bridges Named Week's Athlete

Willie Bridges has been named Male Athlete of the Week for the week of May 2-6 by the Hoke High Coaching Staff.

Willie a 6'0" senior is a member of the Bucks Track Team. He was nominated for his performance in the Southeastern 4A Conference track meet held last Thursday at Pinecrest High School in Southern Pines.

In his specialty, the 800 meter run, Willie won first place in a time of 1:58. This time set a new school record breaking the old record of 1:59.07 set the previous week by Willie.

This time also gives Willie the

second fastest time for the 800 meter run among prep runners this year.

The best time this year is by Brian Ponder of Enka with a time of 1:57.6 only 4/10's of a second faster than Willie.

Willie also ran on the mile relay team. He ran the anchor leg in a time of :51 seconds. The relay team finished 3rd in the conference.

Willie will compete on Friday in the sectional meet to be held on Friday at Scotland.

If he finishes third or higher in this meet he will advance to the Eastern Regionals to be held in Wilson next week.
