She carried a colonial bouquet of white roses, stephanotis and baby's breath, tied with strands of pearls and satin streamers.

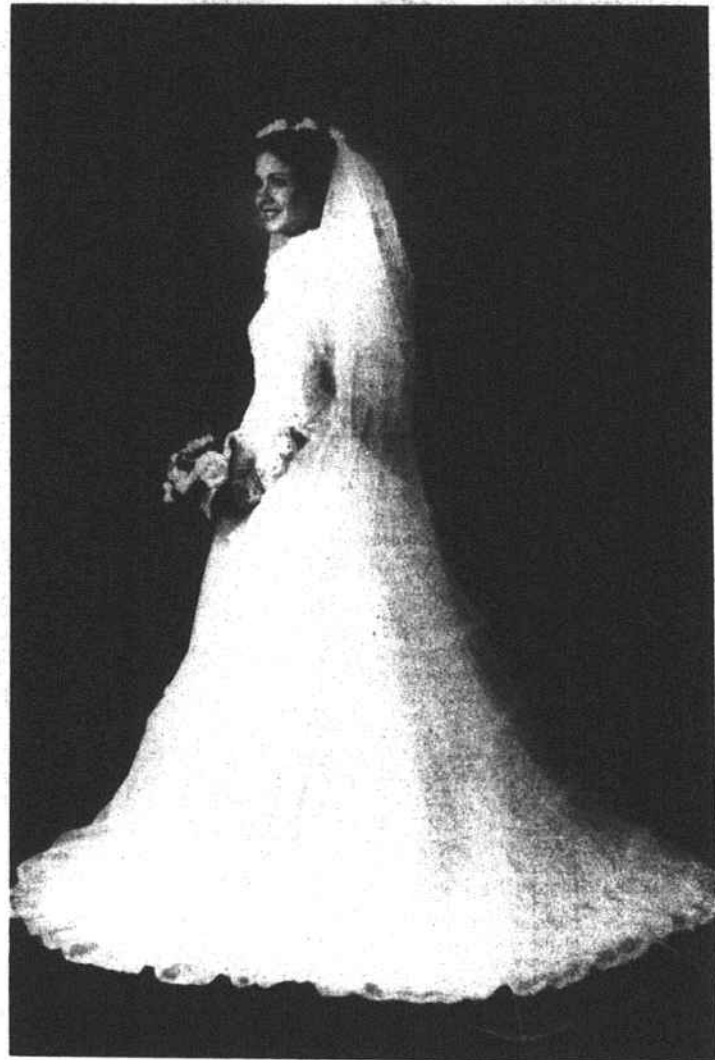

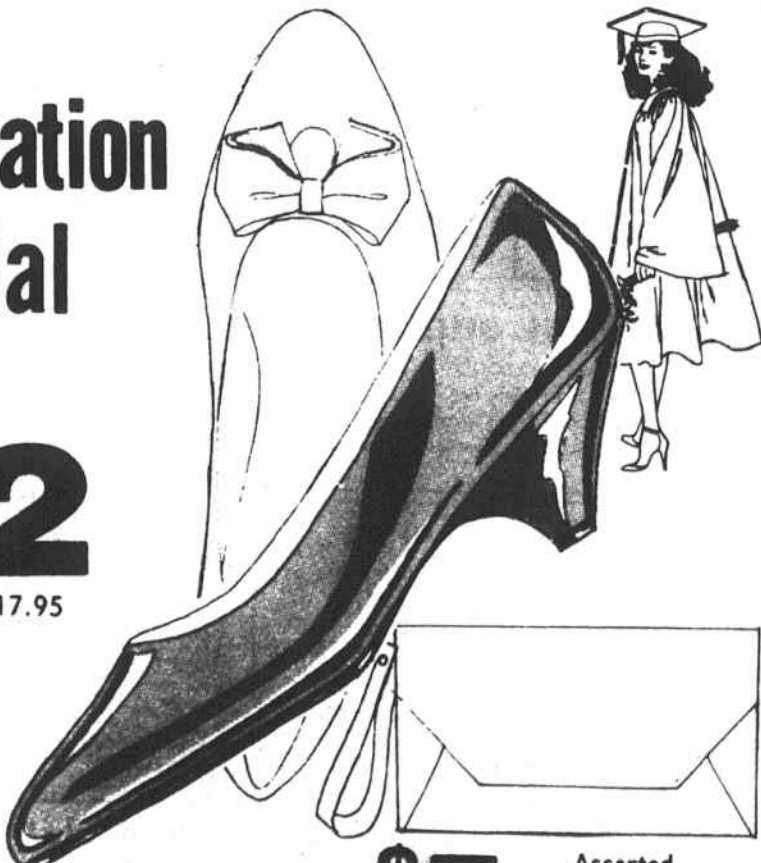
