Miss Strother Feted At Bridal Parties

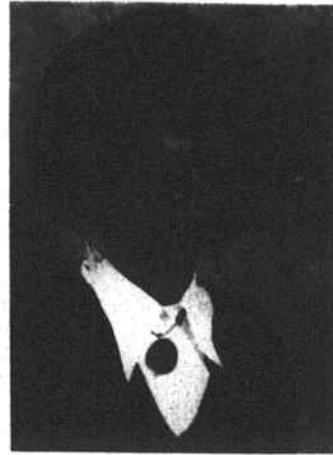
Miss Angela Strother, bride-elect of James Charles Turner, next Sunday, June 25, has been feted at several recent parties.
