## Horsley Takes Golds At Jr. Olympic Trials

On Friday and Saturday, June 24 and 25, Icesonnia Horsley cap-tured two gold medals in the North Carolina Association TAC/USA Junior Olympics State Champion-ships held in the Wallace Wade Stadium at Duke University, Durham.

The meet consisted of teams

from all over the state.

Awards were given to the top six places: medals for first, second and third places, and ribbons for fourth, fifth and sixth places.

Icesonnia competed in four events, capturing awards in three of them.

In the 400 meter dash she took the first place winning a gold

medal; in the 400 meter relay, her team won first place capturing four gold medals, one for each team member; and in the 100 meter dash she placed fourth with a time

of 12.37 Horsley's participation has qualified her to advance to the National Junior Olympics on July 26-31. She will compete in the 400

team. Meanwhile, she, along with other selected teammates, will travel to Ohio where they will compete in the TAC/USA National

Youth Athletics Track and Field

### **Ronnie Locklear Shines 4 Hoke Runners Qualify**

Four members of the IEA Road Runners qualified for the National Regionals in the Junior Olympics State Championships held Friday and Saturday in Wallace Wade Stadium at Duke University in Durham.

To qualify for the National Regionals, to be held in Athens, Georgia on July 8-9, a runner had to place fourth or higher in his event in the State Championship. Topping the list was 12-year-old

Ronnie Earl Locklear who won the State Championship in the 1,500 meter and 3,000 meter races.

In addition to winning first place in both races, Ronnie also set new state records in both events for his age group. Ronnie ran the 3,000 meters in 10:10 cutting 36 seconds

off the old state record of 10:46. In the 1,500 meters, Ronnie ran a 4:50 cutting one second off the old record.

Ronnie, who will be a seventh grader at Upchurch this year, has only been running for six months. According to his coach, Robert Taylor, Ronnie has a tremendous

future in running. "Ronnie is one of the best natural runners I have ever en-

countered. He has competed in DID YOU

many road races, even up to a 15K race (9.3 miles), but I think he has found his niche in the one mile and two mile races. He will train very hard for the National Regionals, and I am sure he will do extremely well. In fact based on his performance in the 1,500 meter in the Junior Olympics State Championship, he has been invited to compete in the East Coast Invitationals on July 15, 16 and 17th in Towson, Maryland," Taylor said.

Three other members of the Road Runners also qualified for the National Regionals.

In the 3,000 meter Midget Age Division (11-12 year olds), Robert Locklear placed third and Ivory Henderson placed fourth.

In the 3,000 meter Youth Age Division (13-14 year olds), Robert Lambert qualified by placing fourth.

Also competing for the Road Runners was Don Woods who placed sixth in the 5,000 meter run and Marty Locklear who placed seventh in the 3,000 meters and eighth in the 1,500 meters.
