Karate Class

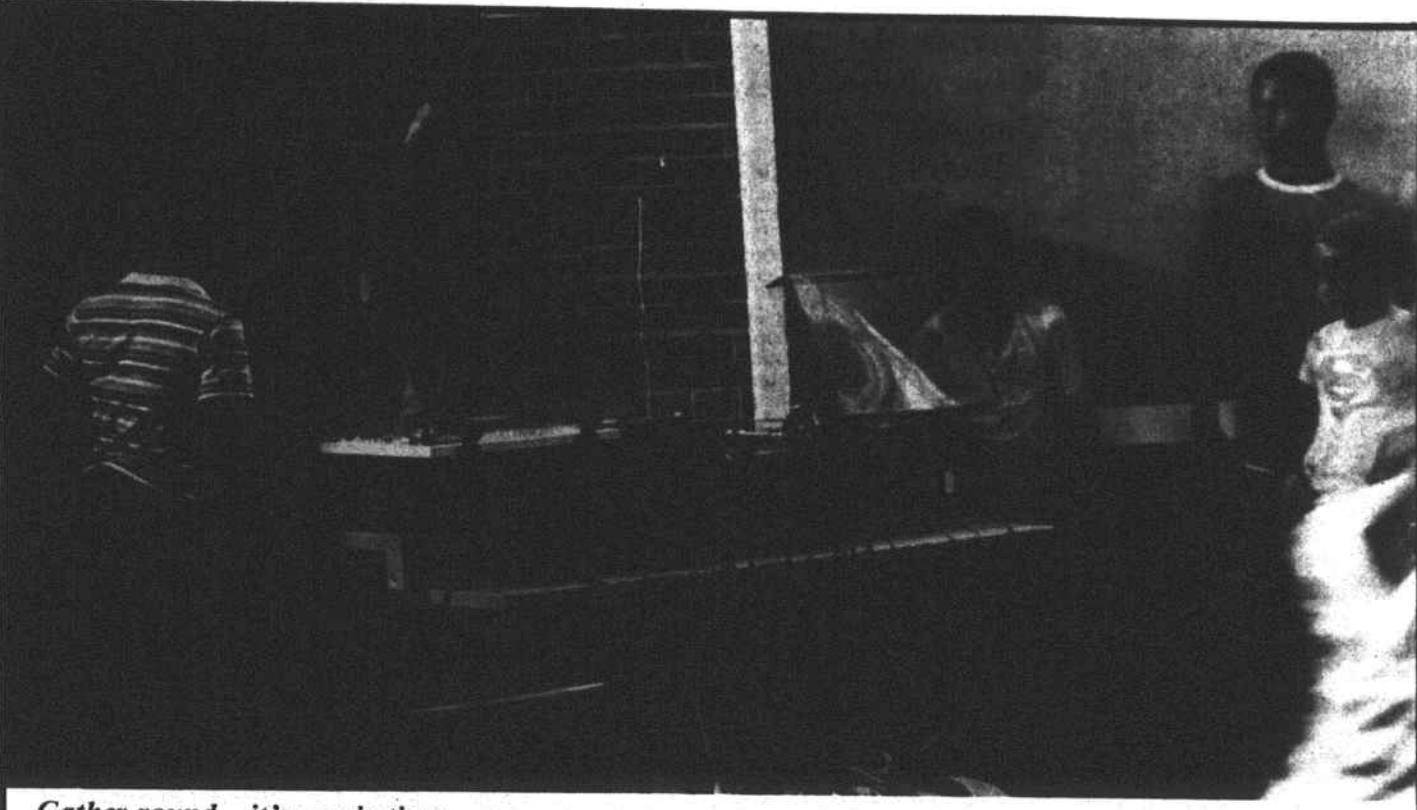

--Upon accepting a challenge, one has three days to play the match. If a person is unable to accept a challenge match within a seven-day period, he or she must relinquish his or her position to the first challenger.

--No other challenge can be made or accepted prior to completion of a match.
