Hoke Man Charged With Rape

A Hoke County man was out on bond Tuesday after being arrested last week on rape charges. Steven Sullivan, 25, of Rt. 1,

Red Springs was arrested Thursday afternoon by Hoke Sheriff's deputies after being accused of raping a Red Springs woman.

According to sheriff's reports, Sullivan and the victim were riding around "drinking beer" when the alleged attack took place just off Highway 211 in Hoke County.

The report shows that Sullivan allegedly pulled into the woods around 10:30 p.m. Wednesday night and attacked the victim.

The victim's statement also alleges that Sullivan threatened harm with a knife if his wishes were not carried out.

Sheriff's deputies arrested Sullivan around 2 p.m. Thursday and placed him under a \$5,000

Sullivan was released on bond

Suspended Sentence Given For Breakin

Cumberland County man plead no contest to charges of breaking, entering and larceny in Hoke District Court Friday.

James Douglass Carver Jr. of Rt. 7, Fayetteville was given a six month suspended sentence on those charges by District Court Judge Elizabeth Keever.

Judge Keever placed Carver on a year's supervised probation and ordered him to pay a \$100 fine and

Keever ordered Carver's probation transferred to Cumberland

Carver was arrested after allegedly breaking into two Hoke residences on November 4 and 5.

Over \$200 in stereo equipment and furniture were taken during the two break-ins.

In other action, a 27-year old Hoke County man plead guilty to two counts of assaulting a law enforcement officer, one count of careless and reckless driving after drinking and one count of failure to stop for a blue light and siren.

Hughie McMillian of Rt. 1, Red Springs was given a two-year suspended sentence on all the charges by District Court Judge Charles Guy during court Thurs-

Judge Guy also instructed McMillian to pay a \$300 fine and court cost. The defendant was also ordered to enroll and complete the alcohol and drug abuse school within 90 days.

McMillian was arrested in

September after he assaulted Raeford Policeman F.E. McQueen and Sheriff's Deputy J.R. Riley.

The defendant allegedly hit Officer McQueen in the throat and chest with his fist while McQueen was attempting to charge him with

careless and reckless driving.

McMillian also attacked Riley. who was apparently trying to assist

McQueen with the arrest. In further action, Blanch Marlene Howie of Rt. 3, Raeford plead guilty to appearing intoxicated and disruptive in a public place after she was arrested for lying on Camp McColl Road and cursing.

Judge Guy gave Howie a 30-day suspended sentence and ordered her to pay a \$10 court cost.

Irmgard Cirener Pate of Hope Mills plead guilty to speeding (49-35) and was given a prayer for judgement upon payment of cost in the action.

Agnes Watson McQueen of Rt. 1, Red Springs plead guilty to ex-

ceeding a safe speed and was ordered to pay the cost of court. Richard Neal Cupyar of Fayetteville plead guilty to exceeding a safe speed and was ordered to pay

the cost of the action. Trent Mario Tabor of Ft. Bragg plead guilty to speeding (67-55) and driving while his license was revoked

Judge Guy gave the defendant a six-month suspended sentence and ordered him to pay a \$300 fine and court cost.

Tabor was also ordered to not operate a motor vehicle until properly licensed.
