The couple and their guests gathered at the Little Whale Restaurant for a party given by

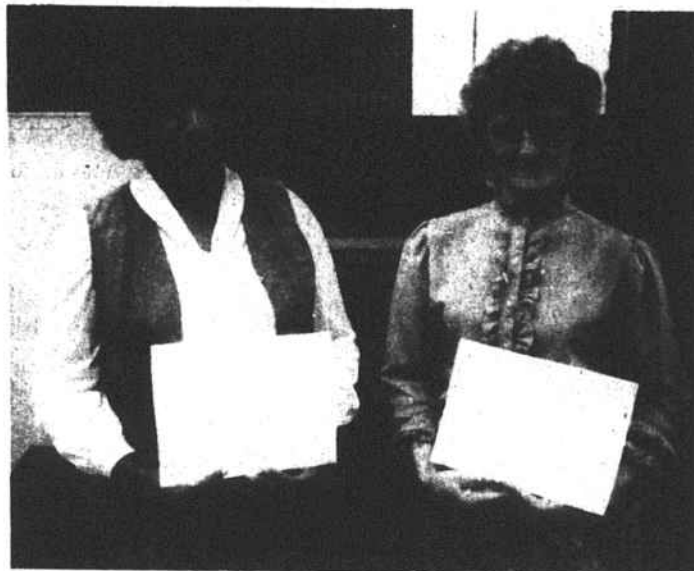
their children, Mrs. Peggy Carr, Mrs. Jane Strother and Jimmy Wood.

A wedding is planned for April 14, 1984 at Freedom Chapel A.M.E. Zion Church.

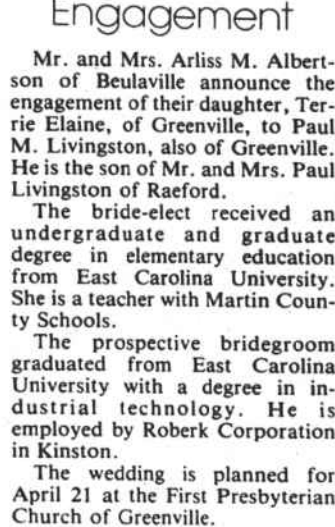
