A good teeth brushing will help dog's breath

DEAR DOCTOR: I have a seven-year-old poodle who is losing her teeth and has bad breath. Our veterinarian cleaned them but it didn't help. She won't eat dry dog food any more. What can be done and what should we feed her?

ANSWER: It seems as though some pets develop tartar on their teeth more quickly than others. Even if your pet has had its teeth cleaned, it may be necessary to repeat the process periodically. You can, however, retard the deposition by brushing your pet's teeth on a routine basis.

As foreign as this sounds to most pet owners, brushing the teeth can be done rather easily if your pet is cooperative. Use a regular toothbrush and either toothpaste or baking soda. Try to clean away the food particles from the upper teeth -- especially along

the cheek teeth.

If your pet has already lost many of its teeth, you may find it necessary to feed canned or soft moist foods.

DEAR DOCTOR: We lost our nine year old Westie about a year ago. She was having trouble eating one day and, after examining her more closely, I realized she couldn't open her mouth. Our veterinarian said it was "Lion Jaw." She died after being put under an anesthetic. I'm not sure just why she died and since we are thinking about getting another Westie I would like more information on this disease.

ANSWER: Your pet had a disease that we don't see very often. The problem your veterinarian referred to as "Lion Jaw" is known as Eosinophilic

myositis. The name means that there is an inflammation of the muscle and, if examined under a microscope, the muscle tissue has an increased number of a type of blood cell called an eosinophil.

The disease can occur in any type of dog at any age. It can affect many muscles of the body but its most dramatic effects are seen with the muscles that control the jaw. As your dog showed you, the muscles that are affected become tense and will not move. Treatment is directed toward reducing the inflammation of the muscle fibers that precede the fiber's destruction. Cortisone is used to control the disease. It is felt that

the disease is caused by the immune system of the body and therefore we don't cure the disease with treatment, we only control it. You should not avoid getting another Westie because of the problem you had with the last one.
