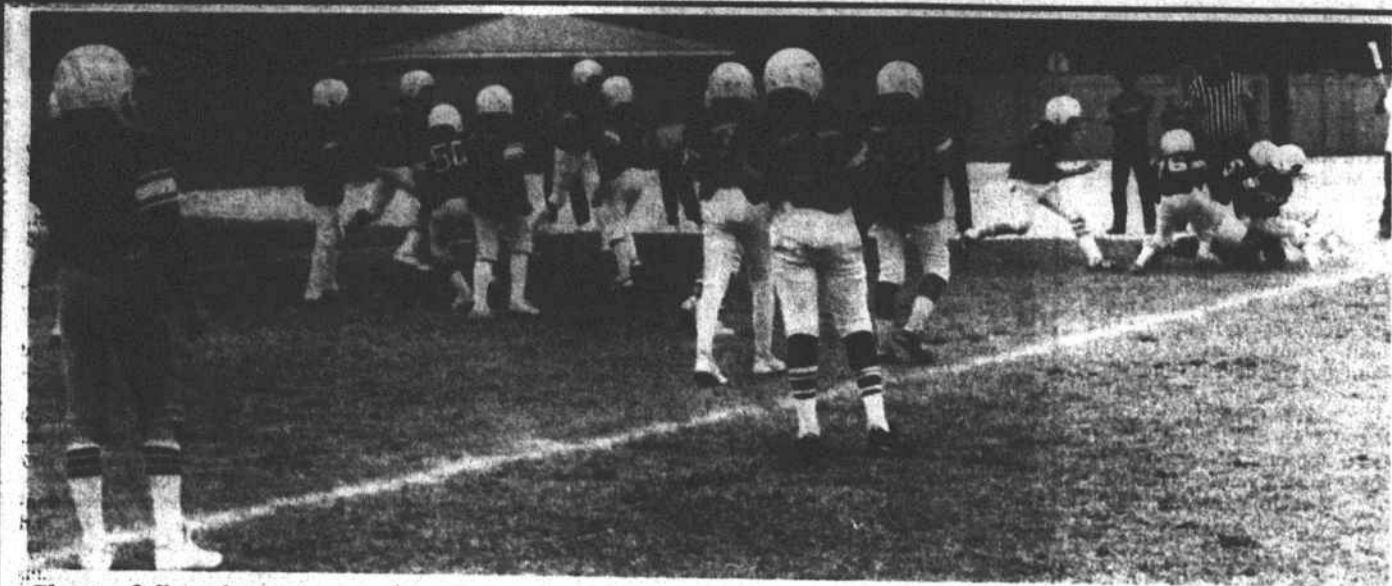


Sports

W. Robeson win puts Bucks in 2nd place

The Hoke High Bucks football team now find themselves locked in a three-way tie for the second conference play-off position after trashing opponents West Robeson 33-7 last Friday night.

"It was a real good win for us," said Bucks Head Coach Tom Jones.

"The game gave Hoke coaches a chance to let a lot of kids play, said Jones.

"A good win like that keeps us alive," he said.

According to Jones, since Terry Sanford lost to E.E. Smith last week, the three-way tie for the second play-off spot was set up between Hoke, Terry Sanford and Reid Ross.

Scotland County High is in the first position, Jones said.

The game, played in Pembroke, featured the running of three Hoke High mainstays, Greg Thompson, Terrell Carpenter and Elgin Blue.

Both Carpenter and Thompson had two touchdowns apiece, Jones said.

Blue ran in for one touchdown. The Buck defense was hot and running last Friday as they held West Robeson to only 78 yards on the ground.

Hoke gained 288 yards rushing. Although a Hoke strong point this season has not been in the air, the team still passed for more yardage than did their opponents.

The Bucks passed for 63 yards while West Robeson passed for only 56.

The team also improved on another weak point that has somewhat plagued the team this season.

Kicker Mac Langdon pipped three out of five during the game, Jones said.

Next week, Jones and his men face tough opponents E.E. Smith. "It's gonna be a tough football game," Jones said.

"They have a good defense," he said.

In their game last week, E.E. Smith held opponents Terry Sanford to negative one yard on the

ground, Jones said.

That team also held Terry Sanford to 88 yard in the air, according to the coach.

The E.E. Smith offense has been moving the ball better lately, said Jones.

"They have a great running back, Bernard Timmons, who is a

junior but has been playing on the varsity team since he was in the ninth grade," Jones said.

Timmons also plays defense, said the coach.

This week's game will be played on Thursday night at the regular time at the Hoke High School Stadium.
