County bonds top \$30,000 quarter mark

Sales of United States Savings Bonds in Hoke County during October-December of 1984 totaled \$30,033. Total sales for 1984 amounted to \$124,449 according to Richard T. Jones, District Director, U.S. Savings Bonds Division.

October-December sales of

United States Savings Bonds in North Carolina amounted to \$13,057,794. Sales this year rose 1.6 percent over 1983, to \$54,108,108, the best sales performance in North Carolina since 1980.

Nationally, sales for 1984 were \$4.0 billion. At year-end, the total value of Savings Bonds held by the

public had reached \$74.51 billion, an increase for the year of more than \$3 billion, or 4%. Bonds holdings are now at their highest level since mid-1980, and have increased more than \$6 billion since

the introduction of the market-based rate system for Savings Bonds in November 1982.
