CP&L program offering savings

If Hoke County residents want a chance to save about \$50 a year, Carolina Power & Light Co. says they may want to check into a new program it is testing in the Southern Pines area.

A.J. Wooddy, CP&L's Southern Pines district manager, says the program involves electric water heaters and the rate charged for electricity.

Participants will have electric service to their water heaters automatically shut off during certain hours of the day. Also, they will agree to switch to the company's time-of-use rate.

On this rate, electricity cost less

when used during "off-peak hours." That's when most people use the least amount of electricity.

CP&L estimates the average participant in the test program will save about \$50 a year, even after paying \$4.25 a month to help cover some of the program's costs. Savings will vary.

Fifty customers in the area can sign up for the program.

To qualify, customers must have an electric water heater and agree to be billed on CP&L's time-of-use rate.

The company says it is conducting the 18-month experiment to find out how people feel about the

time-of-use rate and heating their water during off-peak hours.

"Off-peak water heating allows us to produce electricity more efficiently," Wooddy said.
