of Fayetteville and Little Rock, Ark.  
Examiners will compare dental records with those of Moon.  
"We're ninety-nine percent sure he's our man," Conerly said based on the personal items found on the body.

Conerly said Moon was wanted by the U.S. Marshalls service and the F.B.I. for jumping bail on charges of money laundering and wire tampering, and suspect his illicit activities led to his murder.

While investigators declined to specify how many suspects are involved in the murder, Conerly did say it appears he could have been shot with more than one gun.

If the body is that of Moon, more mysterious circumstances surround his murder than just who killed him and why.

Moon, according to Conerly, lived in Fayetteville in 1991 when he was arrested August 4. Released five days later, Conerly said, the man soon after moved

to Little Rock, Ark.  
In January of 1992 Moon flew back to Fayetteville, where he rented a 1992 white Geo Prism at the airport. He was never seen again.

The rental car was never reported stolen or missing, Conerly said, and the company does not know what happened to the automobile. "No one knows where it is," he said.

Detectives said they were unaware if family or friends ever reported Moon missing.

The changes grandfather in old businesses by allowing them to operate 10 feet from the right of way of any public road.

The county also eased problems for junkyards near homes, schools and churches.

If the business pre-dated the home, school or church, it does not have to conform to 150 foot and 300 foot minimum distances between the two.

"If you're in compliance and somebody moves to you, it won't throw you out of compliance," Yarborough explained.

Some debate arose when County Attorney Neill Yarborough said he thought the changes should only apply to businesses in operation prior to adoption of

the original ordinance — October 20, 1987.

County Manager Mike Wood said he thought the changes would cover all junkyards currently operating in the county. Commissioners also were reticent to apply changes only to the pre-1987 businesses. Chairman L.E. McLaughlin raised the issue of one owner who appeared before the board's last meeting, who purchased his business after October 20, 1987 with no knowledge of the county's regulations.

The young man said he tried to comply with the regulations, and asked the county to work with all the owners.

The board finally discarded the option of considering businesses after 1987 on a case-by-case basis, and opted for

blanket coverage for all current operators.

However, Yarborough said, businesses must still register with the Health Department within the next six months or lose the "grandfather" lenient provisions. All other regulations will still apply.

"This gives them a second chance, another six-month window to come in and get that license," he said. "These amendments make the ordinance easier for pre-existing junkyard owners to live with."

Owners agreed.

"I appreciate what you've done for us tonight," Larry Davis said. Davis owns Bear's Motorcycle Salvage on highway 211 West.

Attorney Neill Yarborough said, because it's a "no blood, no foul situation" between the two companies.

He said eventually the forthcoming

regulations of the cable industry should provide relief for consumers who want the service. Until then, Wood said, more issues will need to be addressed locally.

Yarborough warned the need to address those issues may come sooner than expected. As new housing developments sprout up around the county, more people will want service and will ask the county for changes in the franchise ordinance.

Since the signals of pregnancy are so well known, we will not deal with those here, but rather with danger signals, during pregnancy. They are: increase in nausea and vomiting, severe headaches and dizziness, specks floating before the eyes, puffiness of face especially around eyelids, swelling of feet, ankles or hands, increased desire to urinate, with passage of small amounts, twitching of facial muscles, sudden fever, shortness of breath without exercising, sudden failure to feel baby's movement after once felt. These signals may or may not mean anything, but it is wise to report them to your doctor.
