Conerly said Moon was wanted by the U.S. Marshalls service and the F.B.I. for jumping bail on charges of money laundering and wire tampering, and suspect his illicit activities led to his mur-

While investigators declined to specify how many suspects are involved in the murder, Conerly did say it appears he could have been shot with more than

If the body is that of Moon, more mysterious circumstances surround his murder than just who killed him and

Moon, according to Conerly, fived in Fayetteville in 1991 when he was arrested August 4. Released five days later, Conerly said, the man soon after moved

to Little Rock, Ark.

In January of 1992 Moon flew back to Fayetteville, where he rented a 1992 white Geo Prism at the airport. He was never seen again.

The rental car was never reported stolen or missing, Conerly, said, and the company does not know what happened to the automobile. "No one knows where it is," he said.

Detectives said they were unaware if family or friends ever reported Moon

The changes grandfather in old businesses by allowing them to operate 10 feet from the right of way of any public

The county also eased problems for junkyards near homes, schools and churches

If the business pre-dated the home, school or church, it does not have to conform to 150 foot and 300 foot minimum distances between the two.

"If you're in compliance and somebody moves to you, it won't throw you out of compliance." Yarborough ex-

Some debate arose when County Attorney Neill Yarborough said he thought the changes should only apply to businesses in operation prior to adoption of

the original ordinance — October 20,

County Manager Mike Wood said he thought the changes would cover all junkyards currently operating in the county. Commissioners also were reticent to apply changes only to the pre-1987 businesses. Chairman L.E. McLaughlin raised the issue of one owner who appeared before the board's last meeting, who purchased his business after October 20, 1987 with no knowledge of the county's regulations.

The young man said he tried to comply with the regulations, and asked the county to work with all the owners.

The board finally discarded the option of considering businesses after 1987 on a case-by-case basis, and opted for blanket coverage for all current opera-

However, Yarborough said, businesses must still register with the Health Department within the next six months or lose the "grandfather" lenient provisions. All other regulations will still

"This gives them a second chance, another six-month window to come in and get that license," he said. "These amendments make the ordinance easier for pre-existing junkyard owners to live with.

Owners agreed.




