Unilever, Girl Scouts team up for 'Smart Choices'

"We recognize that there is a nationwide problem of alarmingly low self-esteem among youth," said Steve Kullberg, plant manager for Unilever's Raeford facility, "By distributing the 'Making Smart Choices' boxes to children on our community, we hope to begin to address this issue by getting kids focused on things like summer safety, taking car of yourself by eating well, grooming and personal hygiene and participation in summer sports or activities. Anyone who has information on these and other crimes in Raeford or Hoke County is asked to call the Crimestoppers number at 308-8700.


Callers do not have to identify themselves but are assigned a number in
