Hoke students get help with college selection

Fort Bragg School Liaison Services administers to children of military personnel

Approximately 50 middle and high school students and their parents recently attended a Shopping for College workshop held at the Tolson Youth Activities Center at Fort Bragg. The Fort Bragg School Liaison Services program sponsored the workshop. A team of panelists consisting of a representative from the College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC), a high school guidance counselor from E. E. Smith High School, and admissions representatives from Fayetteville Technical Community College, Fayetteville State University and Methodist College provided information and fielded questions from the participants.

Trae Brookins, Regional Representative from CFNC, provided information on planning, applying, and paying for college. Kelly Lockhart, guidance counselor from E. E. Smith, elaborated on the NCAA clearinghouse and registration requirements for prospective student athletes. Dr. James Kelley, Director of Admissions from Fayetteville Technical Community College, addressed the selection

and admissions processes from the viewpoint of a community college. Brent Hester, of the Office of Admissions from Fayetteville State, discussed the college admissions process from the perspective of the 16 colleges in the UNC system. Jamie Legg, Director of Admissions from Methodist, provided information relevant to the 36 private colleges in the state of North Carolina and the typical enrollment and costs involved.

Students were encouraged to register at HYPERLINK "http://www.CFNC.org" www.CFNC.org. They were advised to plan on doing well and to take challenging courses. One of the panelists recommended that they take the college entrance exams in the spring of the junior year and again in the fall of the senior year.

The importance of visiting campuses was stressed. It was suggested that they visit four to six campuses and to apply for financial aid at every school they were considering. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) deadline is March 1, 2004. Students may apply at HYPERLINK "http://www.FAFSA.ed.gov" www.FAFSA.ed.gov.

Hoke County High School, stated that she "really appreciated" the information. "The process of selecting a college is very stressful. The more knowledge you receive, the less stressful the selection process becomes," she said.

This workshop was one in a series of workshops hosted by the School Liaison Services branch of the Youth

Education Support Services program. The next postsecondary opportunities event will be a College Fair and Financial Aid workshop, scheduled for November 20 at 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. at the Tolson Youth Activities Center.
