Based on testimony before the Senate Subcommittee on Constitutional Rights, it appears a wealth of personal information about Hoke people is stored in data banks of computers in Washington and elsewhere. Each time a citizen files a tax return, applies for credit or life insurance, seeks government benefits or interviews for a public job a dossier is opened under his name, says witness Prof. Arthur Miller of the University of Michigan Law School. Meanwhile the FBI has an estimated 7,000 fingerprints on file of men, women and children living in Hoke County.

Hoke County Schools received \$82,223 from Title III of the National Defense Education Act. It's the 13th year the system has received money from the federal program.
