An Interesting Case.

The railroad commission has a
case of more than common interest.
A cotton gin was shipped from Bir-
mingham, Ala., to a Tarboro man,
via the Richmond & Danville rail-
road. That road took it to Greensboro,
where, by an error, it was sent
to Wilmington. There it was offered
to the Atlantic Coast Line, which de-
clined to receive it saying that it
had a contract with the Richmond
& Danville to the effect that freight
from Birmingham for the Atlantic
Coast Line must be turned over to it
at Columbia, S.C. For a month the
gin was held at Wilmington; then it
was sent to Tarboro. The consign-
ee claims damages. The Atlantic
Coast Line says it had no bill of lad-
ing and claims that this is an inter-
state commerce matter. The con-
signor claims that the Atlantic Coast
Line refused to handle the gin at
Wilmington and said it had no
through bill, the freight was local
and the North Carolina railroad com-
mission has jurisdiction. Mr F H

& Danville in this case. The matter
comes up again on the 25th instant.
