Buried His Heart.

OAKLAND, Cal., June 25 .- A strange incident in the history of Freemasonry, unprecedented in this country, took place at Mountain View cemetery today. It was the burial with Masonic rites of the heart of Ygacia Herreray Cairo, one of the early governors of Mexico, and a Mason, whom members of the order call a martyr to their cause. The heart has for a year been deposited in a casket in the Masonic temple of Oakland, it having been' brought from Mexico to Gethsemane chapel No. 5 of the Rosacroix. At the burial place in Mountain View cemetery the foundation stone of a monument was laid by the grand lodge of Masons of the state. The casket enclosing the heart was wrapped in two silken flags, one American and the other Mexican, and deposited under the foundation of stone. Masons from all over the state were in attendance.
