Massachusetts has a law requiring the publication of a statement of election expenses. It seems that the cost in the state of the national election in 1892 was \$500,000, and that a number of candidates contributed from \$7,000 to \$13,000 each. According to the returns \$85,000 was spent in torchlight processions, \$50,000 for naturalization of voters, and \$30,000 for carriage hire. A law passed this year will prevent any further expenditures in Massachusetts for the naturalization of voters. From these figures in one state the aggregate cost of a presidential campaign in all the states may be figured up. 
