WIFE MURDER AND SUICIDE.

Three Months of Married Life End in a Double Tragedy. HANNIBAL, Mo., Oct. 25.—Solomon Baldwin killed his wife this morning and committed suicide. The couple were married three months ago. He was a widower, 57 years of age, and she was a widow of 37. He had two daughters, married, and she had four children, two of whom were at home.

Double Tragedy in Texas.

SMITHVILLE, Texas, Oct. 25.—This forenoon a shooting occurred on our streets, and as a result a white man and a negro lie ready for the grave. Frank Scott, a negro ex-school teacher, and Charles Chappel, a negro gambler, for some time past have been at loggerheads, and this morning they met and Scott pulled his pistol and fired at Chappel, missing him. Chappel then caught hold of Ed. Turner, a railroad brakeman, and held him in front of him, but Scott shot and hit Turner right above the heart, killing him instantly. Turner's weight bore Chappel to the ground, and as he (Chappel) was on his hands and knees Scott walked up to him and, holding the pistol right over him, shot him through the lungs, from which he died in about five minutes. Scott made no attempt to escape and, as feeling for a time ran high on account of the cold-blooded murder of Turner, the officers deemed it advisable to hurry the assassin off to Bastrop, where he is now lodged in jail.
