The new silver party seems to be unequal to the task of getting itself launched on the sea of politics.

Senator Morrill, of Vermont, who is 85 years old, has announced that he will accept a re-election at the end of his present term.

The armistice declared by the emperor of Japan means that China can secure peace by surrendering everything that has not been captured.

The Monroe doctrine does not establish a United States protectorate over the independent nations of Central and South America, and never was intended to do this.

The monthly treasury statement of the public debt of the U. S. shows that on March 30, 1893, the public debt, less cash in the treasury, amounted to \$908,730,046. The increase for the new four per cent bonds issued during the month was \$28,807,900.

Queen Victoria has given her consent to the bill passed by the South Australian parliament bestowing the full right of suffrage on women. Woman suffrage is now on trial on both sides of the world, and students of politics will watch the results with interest.

The forestry commission of Pennsylvania reports that unless something is done to restore the lumbering resources of the state, industries now producing over \$30,000,000 a year will be destroyed. It also states that 1,600,000 acres of land denuded of timber were sold for taxes last year, the owners considering them valueless.

Lieut. Cornelius C. Smith 23d cavalry, U. S. A. will take a ride of nearly 1000 miles on a single horse and unaccompanied, and will carry neither rations nor forage, but intends to depend solely upon the country through which he travels for sustenance for himself and horse. He will start from Fort Wingate, N. M., and cover the distance to San Antonio, Tex., within a month.

The real fight of the 10,000 striking miners of the Pittsburg, Pa., soft coal district begins this week, as some of the operators will start their mines at the 60 cent rate. A general resumption will not be made for two weeks, as the operators say they will not be able to get coal to lake Erie before April 15 on account of ice. The operators will not import men unless the old hands, who demand 60 cents, refuse to work.

Geographers have made a careful estimate of the population of Africa and place the total at 163,953,000, which is 42,240,000 more than the aggregate population of North and South America. Europe and Africa combined have a population of 521,332,000, though their area is not greater than that of all America. The new world has plenty of room for many times its present population of

121,713,000. The German estimate of the population of the world now is 1,480,000,000, and one of the best authorities of the Royal statistical society says it will be increased by the year 2517 to 33,580,000,000.

Secretary of state Gresham says there is nothing in the rumor that he contemplates resigning his cabinet portfolio. It is said Mrs. Gresham has urged Gresham to resign, on the ground that the secretary's present onerous and exacting duties are detrimental to his health and happiness, but that he has decided to remain at his post, at least until certain important matters concerning foreign relations which he has inaugurated have been consummated.

The movement of cotton since the crop year began, on September 1, 1894, has been the largest on record. In the previous maximum crop season of 1891-92 the total production of the staple as determined by the final count of marketed bales was 9,035,379 bales. Already in seven months of the present season there have come into sight a total of 9,045,078 bales—about 10,000 more than the whole yield of 1891-2. In the latter years the movement for the corresponding period aggregated about 8,352,000 bales; so that the increase in the marketing during the last year has been a little over 8 per cent.

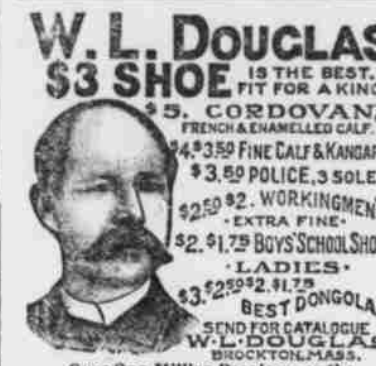
