DECLARES HIS INNOCENCE.

Durant Says That It Will Be Proven.

SAN FRANCISCO, April 29.—For the first time since the charge of murdering Miss Marian Williams in the Emanuel Baptist church of this city was formally made against W. H. T. Durant the prisoner has consented to talk. He spoke first of the Lamont case, saying:

"Poor Blanche. I am accused of strangling her and then remaining unmoved at the details of the most horrible crime in history. No one will ever know the sorrow I feel, and no one can begin to comprehend my thoughts, even if I were to tell all the anguish her terrible fate has caused me. I could not have murdered the girl. I liked her too well; not better than any one else in the world, but I respected and admired her, and we were good friends.

"Judging by newspaper communications I am looked upon as a cold-blooded, diabolical monster. I am painted as a devil in human shape, and very little is said in favor of the possibility of any other person having killed these two girls, but when my trial is over the world will know that I am innocent."
