Orations Delivered by Several Graduates. The Class Has 44 Members. UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA, CHAPEL HILL, N. C. June 6.

The Hill prize was won by C. F. Tomlinson; the Worth prize by H. H. Horne; the mathematical prize by J. T. Farrell.

There were 44 members of the class, of whom 37 are bachelors of arts, 4 bachelors of laws and three post-graduates for special degrees.

The marshals were John F. Shaffner Jr., chief; F. F. Bahnsen, E. P. Carr, J. F. Noce, S. H. Robbins and R. G. Shannonhouse of the Dialectic society.

Several leading universities have official representatives here, all these being professors; these being Princeton, Woodrow Wilson and Mark Baldwin; university of Georgia, A. L. Patterson; university of Texas, Fred. Simmons; Vanderbilt, W. L. Dudley; Washington and Lee, J. L. Howe; university of Virginia, Dr. Paul Barringer; university of South Carolina, J. A. Finn.
