The supreme court of California has decided that "poker-playing for money, however objectionable in fact, is in the eyes of the law as innocent as chess or any game played for recreation, and its votaries and the places where it is played are not criminal."

The people of this state who look at the matter dispassionately say and say truly that the acquittal of Shemwell, the slayer of Dr. Payne at Lexington, is a mockery of justice. It is such a case as this that breed lynchings. The people say almost with one accord that it was Shemwell's money which procured his unrighteous acquittal. That acquittal marks a distinct step backward. It lowers the value of a jury trial. It leads evidently to a return to the old mosaic law of "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth." It leads to judge Lynch's court, a court which terrible and horrible as it is yet makes few errors.

The general idea of the negro population of the south increases as fast as the whites, or even faster, is erroneous, if the figures given by Dr. De Fauscare of Charleston are to be credited. He says that the death rate among the blacks is much larger than among the whites in all of the southern cities, and that the black city population would soon disappear altogether if it were not for the accessions from the country. The increasing inclination of the negroes to move to town will cause a large decrease, he argues, during the next decade; and his figures seem to justify his theory.

This Christian Endeavor movement originated at Portland, Me., in 1881, and at the end of the first year a convention was held there with two hundred delegates, yet this year at Boston there were 50,000, representing an aggregate membership of over 2,500,000. This record of growth is unprecedented in the history of religious or any other kind of organizations. In the comparatively short period of 14 years the order has attained proportions surpassing those of any of the fraternal societies of the country, such as the Masons, the Odd Fellows, the Grand Army of the Republic, the Knights of Labor and the American Federation of Labor. It is excelled in numerical strength only by the Roman Catholic and Protestant churches.

"If President Lincoln, in 1861," says the New York Recorder, "had issued an order for the summary shooting of every Confederate soldier captured in arms, all Europe would have interfered to prevent such an outrage on civilization." According to reports from Cuba Gen. Campos has issued just such a savage order, and some of the most influential papers in this country declare that if he abides by it the United States should call him down. There is a point where the American people will cease to be neutral, and that is when the laws of civilization and humanity are violated. If the Cuban insurgents are to be hunted, captured and shot like beasts, there are plenty of Americans who will say the sooner we recognize them as belligerents and accord them belligerent rights the better.

Returns to the Indian bureau show an aggregate population of aborigines in the entire country of 248,253.

This does not include the native population of Alaska, which is of a distinctly dissimilar type from the American Indian with all his variations of physiognomy and tribal peculiarities. It is surprising to discover from these fresh statistics that a very large proportion of our Indians support themselves without aid from the government. The number of these self-supporting Indians in the aggregate is 212,900. There are 133,417 Indians living on reservations. Nearly all these who earn their own living do so by agricultural pursuits, to which the women share the labor and the results.
