The successful use of electricity as a motive power on steam roads has led the Baldwin locomotive works of Philadelphia and the Westinghouse electric and manufacturing company to effect a combination. It is expected that the union of these two companies will result in the early introduction of improved forms of electric motors for standard railroads.
