We are sorry to say that the most flagrant example of this intolerance is shown by the Biblical Recorder when its editor takes a reception given by the patriotic Catholics of this city to the soldiers in the second regiment as an occasion for a vicious and untimely tirade against the Catholic church. The editor of the Recorder writes:

"Roman Catholic priests may succeed in thrusting themselves upon the Second Regiment of North Carolina Volunteers, but the average soldier knows that these very holy whiterobed fathers are owned by the Pope, and that the Pope did his best to stay the arm of our Nation when it was about to be stretched forth in behalf of Cuba, and that he wished he were dead when his efforts were repudiated by President McKinley. The priests may preach, but citizens of this county where Pome stands and know where Rome stands, and laugh when they see one of them mumbling piously to our soldiers while another at Manila calls upon the Spanish and the natives in the name of God and the Pope to rise up and fight to the death "the apostate, barbarous, women-slaying Americans."
