But the Mayor had the power to try such a case as Mayor under the ordinance for loud and boisterous, indecent or profane language on the street, and inflict such punishment as comes within his jurisdiction, or, he could have tried the case under the common law of nuisance, as ex-ordero justice of the peace. and bound the defendant over to the Superior Court where more severe punishment could be meted out to such offenders.

Another matter leading to many offenders going unpunished is the indisposition of citizens to report violations of law and their reluctance at being witnesses. In many cases applications are made for criminal warrants with a request that the party inured and applying will not be used as a witness. This is very wrong and very often is the reason warrants are not issued.
