Damages for mental anguish are compensatory and will not be awarded in an action which calls for punitive or vindictive damages, as in the present case, where the plaintiff seeks to recover damages for mental anguish caused by the unlawful seizure and detention of certain personal property. (Mental anguish caused by the loss of a child, and distress occasioned by the loss of a pig, dis inguished.)


