AGAINST POLYGAMY.

Amendment to the constitution prohibiting polygamy within the United States and disqualifying polygamists for election as Senators or Representatives in Congress.

The resolution submits to the Legislature of the States an amendment to the sections of the constitution giving the age and other requirements of Senators and Representatives so that polygamy shall be included as a bar to service.

"Article 18—Section 1. Polygamy shall never exist within the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction. Section 2. Congress shall have power to make all needful laws to enforce this article and punish its violation."
