ROME'S 2,652D BIRTHDAY.

On Friday, April 21, the city of Rome celebrated its 2,652d birthday. That is a respectable age, and it embraces an immense history, which, in a special manner, shows the rise and fall of governments, and the experiences of all the phases that the human mind seems capable of inventing. The day was honored by the Roman municipality by the exhibition of flags on the municipal buildings, and by the holding of a special session by the German Archaeological Institute, which assembles near the Palaggo Caffarelli, on the Hill of the Capitol, on the site where of old stood the historical Temple of Jupiter Capitolinus.

The historian Livy, in beginning his account of the origin of Rome and its legendary character, notes that it partakes more of the character of poetical fiction than of what belongs to the genuine records of history. This indulgence, he says, is conceded to antiquity, that by blending things human with divine, it may make the origin of cities appear more venerable, and if any people might be allowed to consecrate their origin, and to ascribe it to the gods as its authors, such is the renown of the Roman people in war, that when they represent Mars, in particular, as their own parent and that of their founder, the nations of the world may submit to its paternity as they submit to their sovereignty.
