The Mormons or Latter Day Saints, as they style themselves, have become very active in this State again. They are now making a house to house canvass in Moore and Bertie counties. It seems that any "schism" under the sun can find some followers in North Carolina. The fact that the Lynchites and Fire Baptizers have made any progress shows how easily the ignorant can be led into any belief that has a few followers. Judging by the conduct of these Fire Baptizers, Lynchites, etc., would it not be preferable to import some disciples of Buddha or Mahomet to this State? Could their propaganda be more demoralizing or degrading? Authentic information was recently officially given here that in Richmond the members of a Woman's Baptist Foreign Missionary Society had gone over bodily to the Mormons. It might be in order to inquire if one man took in the whole crew.

Next week the saloons in Warren county will be supplanted by the dispensary. Representative Henderson says that he will not adopt Reed's rules when he becomes speaker.

Since the Spaniards were driven from Cuba over 2,000 saloons have been opened. Cuba is now Americanized.

In address before Wafford College, Senator McLaurin of South Carolina declared that from the logic of history the duty of the United States is to accept the newly acquired territory as a sacred trust for God and humanity. He made a strong expansion speech.

The penitentiary directors refuse to change the warrants to conform with the State Treasurer's letter. We don't know who is right, the State Treasurer or the directors, but we do know that it is not right to withhold the money from the creditors of the penitentiary. Already some of them have waited a year for their money.

The latest issue of The Sing Sing Star of Hope, published by the inmates of the penitentiary, has this to say of a serial story written by No. 321: "From the North Cape to Venice" will be continued during the author's next 'bit.' His sentence was commuted on June 9, 1899, and excused, of course, from steady contribution. 'Et paulo majora cantant!'

The Wilson News, agreeing with Dr. Shearer, of Davidson College, says: "By all means let the Bible be used as a text book in the schools. Let the beauties and the truths of the Book of Books be taught in every North Carolina school and within her borders there will arise a type of citizenship that will reflect added lustre and glory upon the fair name of the State."
