ADMIRAL DEWEY CALLED A SOCIALIST

The latest assertion in regard to Admiral Dewey is that he is a Socialist. This will be indeed a serious charge against the Admiral in some quarters, but the day has certainly passed when the credulity of men can be fooled down with the assertion that they are socialists.

No one can doubt that there are now many of our people who are socialists. It is not surprising, therefore, that the charge is made against the Admiral. It is a charge which is not only unwarranted, but also unjust.

But to return to Admiral Dewey, the assertion that he is a socialist is based on the grounds of a remark of his, which is obviously a gross misquoting of the Admiral's words.

A. M. Dewey, Special United States Labor Commissioner and a son of Admiral Dewey, at Spokane, Washington, October 15, 1895, said in the course of a speech:

"I declare before you all, my fellow Americans, that I have never in my life, and in my heart, I never will, acknowledge myself as a socialist. I only know that Admiral Dewey is a man of rare qualities and a true student of economics. And I do not believe he would ever, by word or deed, knowingly do any injury to a fellow creature. And I do not believe his views of the social and industrial question are so very different from my own."

THE SOUTHERN EXPANSION.

It is our sincere conviction that a majority of the people of the South are in favor of expansion. Senator Sullivan, of Mississippi, has been in Washington this week and was interviewed by the Washington Post.

"In Mississippi, where I have done a great deal of campaigning this summer, I found my audience thoroughly in sympathy with the policy of annexation and wider markets. My opponents for the senatorship, ex-Governor Lewis, cited me as a horrible example of imperialism, but somehow, when replying to him, I alluded to the advantages to accrue to the South by reason of increased production for our cotton, wool and woolen goods."

There is no sagacity of broad statesmanship in waiting to see the position assumed by an opposite political party and then taking the other side. 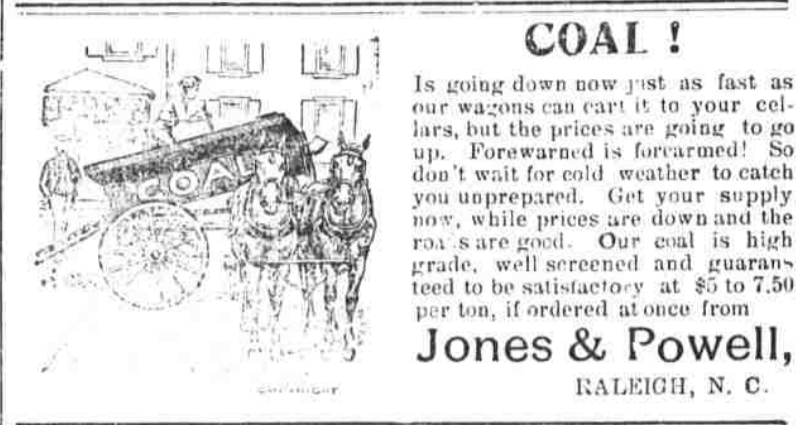
