To some they may seem dippart and frivolic; to many they night appear common, yet the wit and human parture deep down beneath the lines are refreshing and wholesome.

In this little book, Ade has brought out the best and the worst in us- the solemn and the ridiculous, the grave and the gay, the wicked and the wise. His story of the "Broad Woman, who had norbing else to do" and so "became benevolest," is true to life and ends with the moral: "When mulifting, get underneath.' An extremely humorous bit is the summing up of all fiction into hight classes, worth the nioney to those who are kept guessing in an attempt to be up on the latest novels.
