WESTERN JUDGESHIP.

The Judiciary committee of the United States Senate last evening decided adversely to the confirmation of Judge Ewart, appointed by President McKinley as Judge of the Western District of North Carolina. This is the termination of a long bitter fight. Senator Prichard has fought manfully for Judge Ewart's confirmation by the Senate while Senator Butler has just as strenuously opposed Judge Ewart. Twice has President McKinley at Senator Prichard's urgent solicitation reappointed Judge Ewart, but his almost certain reappointment by the Senate must end his aspiration for a place on the Federal Bench. Senator Butler, aided by such Republicans as Senators Blair and Spooner, has effectively compassed his defeat. Personally Judge Ewart has our sincere sympathy, for only those who know the man will realize what a severe blow this failure is to him, yet for once there can be little doubt that Senator Butler was right in his opposition. Mr. Ewart has given abundant demonstrations of the fact that he lacked those qualifications which the occupants of such an exalted position should possess. He failed to gain confirmation in spite of the warm friendship which all the Southern Senators have for him because of his earnest and timely opposition to the so-called "Ewart Bill" which passed the House while he was in Congress from the North North Carolina District.

Speculation is now rife as to whom President McKinley will appoint to this position. A rumor says that District Attorney Holton may be made Judge and Ewart become District Attorney, while the names of Governor Ross, Captain Charles Price, Judge R. B. Douglas and Col. James E. Boyd are also mentioned. Congressmen Linn may also be brought forward in this connection.

INSTRUCTED FOR BRYAN.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 11. Six delegates to represent the District of Columbia Populists at the coming national convention of that party, were chosen last night and instructed to use all honorable means to procure the nomination of Mr. Bryan. The meeting was held at the headquarters of the Antitrust League, 1229 Pennsylvania avenue, Rev. Alexander Kent presiding. It was the sense of those who attended that delegates should take such action as will tend to harmonize the Populist Party, the Democratic party and the silver wing of the Republican party, and that a double candidate scheme for the Vice Presidency should not be attempted if a second time. The delegates were given instructions accordingly.

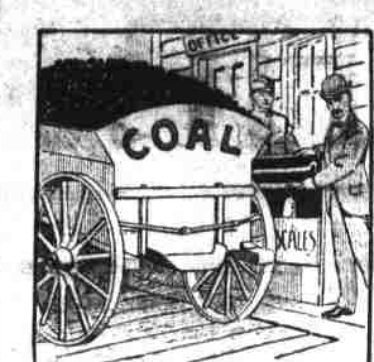
