

MORGAN SAYS CALL CONGRESS.

Democratic Leaders Thinks The President

Needs Aid. Huntsville, Ala., July 17.—In a letter to a personal friend in Huntsville, Senator John T. Morgan, of Alabama, gives his opinion on the Chinese question. 
