A New Haven Preacher Experiments

With Hypnotic Treatment.
New Haven, Conn., Sept. 3.—The experiment which the Rev. George B. Cutten, pastor of the Howard Avenue Baptist Church, has been making this summer in the cure of intoxication and the cigarette habit by means of hypnotic suggestions are interesting the psychological students at the university who are in town. Mr. Cutten is a graduate of the Divinity School of two years ago, and in the football season of 1898 was centre rush on the Yale team.

Mr. Cutten's attention was first attracted to the possibilities of hypnot-ism as a means of curing evil habits ism as a means of curing evil habits by some amateur experiments two years ago. He at once took up its close study, and chose the theme for his thesis for a dectorate which he will present next spring at the Yale commencement, naming his thesis the "Psychology of Inebriates." To discover just what possibilities there were in store for the hynotic experts, Mr. Cutten began a series of trials, which have born interesting and un-

looked-for results. He has proved first, that ordinary hynotic treatment can affect a speedy change for the better in the case of an addicted partient; secondly, that such improve-ment is in most cases to which he has given close attention, and in all of them he says that he has effected cures. He believes that with ordinary care and attention drunkenness and the eigarette habit can be successfully eradicated, and is of the opinion that there is a great future for the hypnotist who will devote himself to such work among the criminal classes.
