STATE.

Meetings are being held in the interest of the Fayetteville and Goldsboro Railroad along the route. The Charlotte people are in raptures over the expected visit of Edwin Booth. A colored woman accidentally smothered her child in Wadesboro a few nights ago. The store-house of Mr. Farmer, in Wadesboro, was totally consumed by fire a few nights since. Four young boys from Wilmington, aged between sixteen and twenty left lately on foot for the West. Mrs. Hannah celebrated her centennial last Sunday, by joining the Methodist church in Wadesboro. 12 convicts from New Hanover county have died in the penitentiary during the past year. Hon. Jesse J. Yeates, of Hertford, has been elected President of the Weldon Fair Association. John T. Britt, of the late Oxford Leader, was married on Wednesday morning to Miss Emma L., daughter of R. J. Mitchell, Esq., of Oxford. The Dialectic Society of the North Carolina University has tendered Mr. T. B. Kingsbury the full use of its valuable library, it having learned that he proposed writing a history of North Carolina. Winston Sentinel: On last Saturday, Willie Ganoway, a very bright and promising lad of 13 years, a son of Dr. Robt. Galloway, of Rockingham county, while loading his gun let the breech slip off of the door step, striking the hammer of a loaded barrel, which discharged the gun, sending the contents into his thigh and severing the large artery, killing him in a few minutes. Says the Wilmington Journal of Tuesday: "On the down train from Weldon to Wilmington last Saturday night, Capt. James Borden, the conductor, discovered a white man in the act of robbing a lady passenger. He promptly knocked the pickpocket down and chastised him severely, after which he stopped his train and kicked the ruffian off into the woods. The Captain deserves credit for this action and he served the fellow right." A huge bear was killed the other day near Long's Mills, Caswell. The shoulder of Mr. John Barnheart, of Rowan, was eminent on a few days. To establish several tobacco warehouses in Salisbury, says the Watchman. We learn from the Gazette that a large dwelling house four miles from Fayetteville, known as the "Jno. A. Williams house," and now the property of Mr. Jas. M. Smith, Jr., was burned down last Monday about midday. The building was insured for only \$2,200 of its value. The Fayetteville Gazette informs us that an enthusiastic meeting held at Newton Grove, Sampson county, on the 28th ult., subscribed 2,000 dollars toward a survey of the Fayetteville and Goldsboro Railroad. A meeting held at Grant & Harris' store, Wayne county, on the 30th, made a small subscription for the same purpose. It is the intention of the President to organize a corps for the survey, and have it in the field by the 22d of this month. Asheville Expositor: Judge Dick, in speaking of the abuse of the officers of this court in the issuance of process, said he had heard of a case in Madison county where a party had been indicted for cutting logs for a man who was building a still-house. This man was indicted as an illicit distiller! Another case of a party selling a few hands of frosted tobacco to a neighbor. We are glad to witness the efforts of Judge Dick to correct the many abuses in the management of commissioners and other officers of this court. He announces a new set of rules with a view to correct these abuses. "WASHINGTON'S CHAIR." When we lived in Edenton, N. C., there was in the possession of the Masonic Lodge a splendid chair, said to be the one used by General Washington when Master of the Lodge in Alexandria, Va. The tradition is that this chair was sent to Edenton, N. C., for safe keeping, at the beginning of the revolution of 1776. It is known to have been in the possession of the Edenton Lodge since 1778, and the Lodge of Virginia has twice demanded its restoration. The matter is now being investigated, and should the tradition prove true this chair will become a valuable addition to our centennial furniture. It is of itself a valuable relic of the past age, and a great curiosity. We hope the masters of North Carolina may establish its high claim to a place in our temple. -Biblical Recorder.
