Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 30.—That the United States government takes care of the families of men who are missing in action, is shown by the thousands of dollars paid in allotments each month to the dependents of these men, according to Lt. Colonel J. H. Bush, Army Emergency Relief Officer, headquarters, Fourth Service Command.

Under present law allowance to families of missing men can be paid for only 12 months. At the end of that time the head of the department concerned is authorized to make a finding of his death, which procedure will enable the payment, following the finding, of the six months gratuity provided by law.
