NEW YORK, March 8.—An 11-pound package of American Red Cross plans to send every American war prisoner in enemy camps throughout the world each week will contain:

HICKORY, March 4. — Miss Catherine Stirewalt and Miss Mary C. Sullivan, missionaries who are related to Hickory residents, are among 154 American civilians announced today by the War department as interned by Japan in occupied China.

Miss Sullivan is a sister of Prof. M. L. Stirewalt of Lenoir Rhyne college faculty, and Miss Sullivan is the stepdaughter of Mrs. Claudia H. Sullivan of Hickory. She is better known as Miss Clara Sullivan.
